

MATERIALS:

[1] AOSH Panel

[38] AOSH Collectible Quilt Shop Squares

1/3 yard Yellow, Blender

1/3 yard Red, Blender

1/3 yard Lime, Blender

1/3 yard Blue, Blender

3/4 yard Aqua, Blender

1/4 yard Cream, Blender

1/2 yard fabric for Binding

3-1/2 yards fabric for Backing

[7] 6-1/2" squares, using any of the Ohio Regional squares, when possible, for bottom row

RECOMMENDED TOOLS:

2-1/2" finished size Thangles, or your favorite HST ruler

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. SEW PIECES RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER AND USE A 1/4 SEAM ALLOW-ANCE THROUGHOUT UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. WOF = WIDTH OF FABRIC. RST = RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER; HST = HALF SQUARE TRIANGLE

CUTTING:

From AOSH Collectible Quilt Shop Blocks:

Trim [38] -4-1/2" squares

From AOSH Region Blocks:

Trim [6] - 6-1/2" squares

Note: In the pictured sample, other prints from the Ohio Shop Hop fabric collection are used in place of the regional squares.

From Blender, Blue and Yellow Fabric:

Cut [1] $-4-1/2" \times WOF$ strip Subcut [9] -4-1/2" squares

From Blender, Lime Fabric:

Cut [1] $-4-1/2" \times WOF$ strip Subcut [5] -4-1/2" squares

From Blender, Cream Fabric:

Cut [1] $-3" \times WOF$ strip Cut [1] $-2-1/2" \times WOF$ strip

Subcut [10] -2-1/2" squares

From Blender, Red Fabric:

Cut [1] - 3" imes WOF strip

Cut [2] - 4-1/2" \times WOF strip

Subcut [10] -4-1/2" squares

From Blender, Aqua Fabric:

Cut [4] - 3-1/2" \times WOF strip

Subcut [4] - 3-1/2" \times 42-1/2" rectangles

(*Note:* if you don't have 42-1/2" of usable fabric, cut an additional strip, piece all [5] strips together end to end and subcut the

[4] - 3-1/2" \times 42-1/2" strips from that length

Cut [1] - 4-1/2" \times WOF strip

Subcut [4] - 4-1/2" squares

Cut [1] $- 2-1/2" \times WOF strip$

Subcut [1] $- 2-1/2" \times 12-1/2"$ rectangle

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:


Ohio Star Blocks

Using the 3" × WOF Blender, Red and 3" × WOF Cream Blender strips, sew [4] - 2-1/2" finished size half square triangles from Thangles paper. This will yield [8] half square triangles. Press toward the dark. Or, use your favorite method to make [8] - 3" HST.




2. Next, sew the hourglass units. Place [2] HST right sides together, [1] with light at the top and [1] with dark at the top. Draw a diagonal line down the center opposite of the stitched diagonal. Sew a scant 1/4" on each side of the drawn line. Cut units apart on the drawn line and press open the hourglass unit. Make [8] hourglass units. Trim to 2-1/2" square.

- 3. Lay out [4] hourglass units and [5] Blender, Cream 2-1/2" squares like the Ohio Star block as shown.
- 4. Sew into a block. Block measures 6-1/2" square unfinished. Make [2].



Panel Border Assembly

- 1. Trim and square up Panel to $36-1/2" \times 42-1/2"$.
- 2. Sew [2] of the [4] 3-1/2" \times 42-1/2" Blender, Aqua strips to the left and right sides of the Panel. Press.
- 3. Next, sew the remaining Blender, Aqua strips to the top and bottom of the Panel. Trim to $42-1/2'' \times 48-1/2''$.




Row Assembly

- 1. **SEW RIGHT SECTION.** Lay out [18] AOSH Collectible Quilt Blocks, [5] Blender, Yellow, [4] Blender, Lime, [5] Blender, Red and [4] Blender, Blue 4-1/2" squares as shown right. Sew squares into [3] columns.
- Then, sew the columns together to make the Right Section. Right Section is 12-1/2" × 48-1/2". Pay attention to the directional wording on the AOSH Collectible Quilt Blocks, if desired.



- 3. **SEW TOP SECTION.** Lay out [20] AOSH Collectible Quilt Blocks, [4] Blender, Yellow, [1] Blender, Lime, [5] Blender, Red, [4] Blender Aqua and [5] Blender, Blue 4-1/2" squares as shown below. Sew squares into [3] rows.
- 4. Then, sew the rows together.
- 5. Sew [1] 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" Blender, Aqua rectangle to the left side of the rows to make the Top Section. Top Section is 54-1/2" \times 12-1/2".



- 6. **SEW BOTTOM SECTION.** Sew [7] 6-1/2'' Regional squares together into a row.
- 7. Then, sew an Ohio Star block to the left and right sides of the row. Row is $6-1/2" \times 54-1/2"$.



QUILT TOP ASSEMBLY:

- Using the Quilt Assembly Diagram, sew the
 [3] sections of the quilt to the bordered panel.
 First, sew the Right Section to the right side
 of the bordered panel.
- 2. Next, sew the Top Section to the top of the unit from the previous step.
- 3. Then, sew the Bottom Section to the bottom of the unit from the previous step. Quilt top is $54-1/2'' \times 66-1/2''$.



FINISHING:

- 1. Layer quilt top, batting, and backing together and quilt as desired.
- 2. Sew [7]— 2-1/4" binding strips together end to end to make continuous double fold binding. Bind as desired.
- 3. Enjoy!
